The County offered a couple of minor changes non-monetary of course and told us they were broke and couldn't afford to even provide us a 1% increase or a cost of living increase.

The County openly admitted they were unwilling to stand behind their deputies and show support for a difficult job we have.

Dispatch Safety Issues.
